ABOUT THE PROJECT

For children and young people who have experienced living in alternative care, separated from their biological family, the process of growing up is extremely demanding because they are often left without formal support and a functional social network. They also face many other challenges that independent living brings.

YOUTH MOVING is an Erasmus+ project aimed at enhancing care leavers participation in democratic life in Europe, through their empowerment as active citizens, especially addressing how to connect with, express their views and be heard by stakeholders in the alternative care field. The aim will be achieved through two project results:

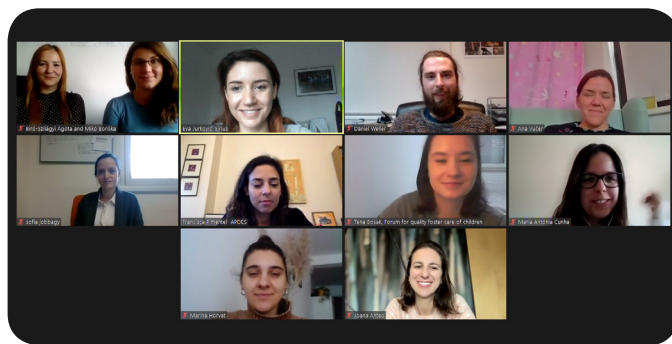
1. curriculum of workshops aimed at encouraging the participation of young people from alternative care in the democratic processes of society and
2. video material for raising public awareness and policy makers awareness about the importance of participation of young people from alternative care in democratic processes.

THE AIM AND ACTIVITIES OF THIS PROJECT are focused on:

- strengthening the competencies of people working with youth from alternative care,
- to encourage youth to actively participate in society,
- to overcome limitations and
- to provide opportunities for young people to express their opinion.

1ST TRANSNATIONAL PROJECT MEETING

The first transnational meeting was held online, hosted by the coordinator, Sirius on 6-7th December 2021. All partner representatives presented their organisations regarding their scope of influence and implementation, organisational background, previous experience, human capital and expressed their willingness for full participation in this project. During the meeting Sirius, the project coordinator presented the project's main idea, and explained the background, why it has an important role for the target group. Also, the coordinator presented the aims and objectives and the planned outputs of the projects and their respective activities. Detailed presentation was prepared with all steps needed to be done for each project result to be delivered. There was also time allocated to management, to elaborate the dissemination plan and the stakeholder's list, which was explained by the Romanian partner, DGASPC HR. The Italian partner, Co&So presented the Quality Management Handbook, the evaluation of progress, quality and achievements of the project. APDES informed the participants regarding the development of the curriculum of workshops aimed at encouraging the participation of young people from alternative care in the democratic processes. This is necessary in order to do research on the involvement of youth and EU good practices. FAMO presented some options for movie making, different styles for the film that will show different stories of young people from alternative care – documentary, narrative, animation. This movie will portray different challenges that young people from alternative care face while moving out. The partners agreed that the Learning/Training/Teaching event which will be organized next year, is a great opportunity where young people from partner countries will have the chance to participate in learning advocacy skills through filming and editing. Through this activity the partnership wants to show policy makers in Europe their problems while leaving the care.
